<u>Course Objectives:</u> This course will cover mathematical concepts such as mathematical reasoning (logic), sets, functions, number theory, equivalence relations and cardinality. We will use these concepts to develop the ability to prove mathematical statements using various techniques, including such as a direct proof, proof by contradiction, counter-example, and mathematical induction.
