COURSE DESCRIPTION

Prerequisite: Math 161A with a minimum grade of 'C' or equivalent

Course Objectives: Improper integrals, infinite series, Taylor Polynomials

Calculator Policy: While a graphing calculator is not required for this course, you may find one to be useful. We recommend a TI-83 or TI-84. You are not allowed to use a TI-89 calculator or higher. During exams, mobile phones and other electronic devices are not acceptable substitutes for calculators; as such, it will not be allowed.

Homework: A selection of problems will be collected and graded on a weekly basis.

Exams: There will be a midterm and a cumulative final exam.
